

# Pope's Prayer Intentions for May 2024: For the Formation of Religious and Seminarians

We pray that religious women and men, and seminarians, grow in their own vocations through their human, pastoral, spiritual and community formation, leading them to be credible witnesses to the Gospel.

# Reflection by James Kubicki SJ

A religious vocation, whether to the priesthood or consecrated life, is not a career, just as marriage is not a career. It's a call, the response to an inspiration from God. Yet, like a career, it involves education.

In 1990, Bishops from around the world met in a Synod to discuss the formation of priests. Afterwards, Pope St. John Paul II wrote the Apostolic Exhortation "Pastores Dabo Vobis," referring to Jeremiah 3: 15: "I will give you shepherds after my own heart."

In addition to academic and pastoral formation, priests and consecrated persons especially need spiritual and human formation. Their hearts, their deepest interiors from which flow their thoughts, words, and actions, must be conformed to be more like the Heart of Jesus which Pope Francis called "the greatest human expression of divine love." The way God chose to reveal his infinite love was through the human love of Jesus and the same will be true for today's priests and religious.


As Jesus called apostles and disciples to follow him and to form a community of love around him, so the spiritual and human formation of seminarians and religious is accomplished best in a community where individuals act against the individualism by learning to live in harmony, sacrificing personal interests for the common good.

This human, spiritual, and communitarian formation is so important that the United States Bishops have mandated an extra period of formation that precedes the academic and pastoral formation of seminarians.

Future Church leaders will be convincing witnesses to the extraordinarily Good News of God's love revealed in Jesus only in so far as their hearts become more like the Heart of Jesus, broken and pierced out of love for all God's children.

Fr. James Kubicki, SJ, serves as a spiritual director at St. Francis de Sales Seminary in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. He is a popular conference and parish mission speaker, retreat director, and the author of A Heart on Fire and A Year of Daily Offerings. Kubicki previously served as the national director of the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network.



# GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It's easy for me to get impatient with the Lord - to wonder why he makes me wait for an answer to a prayer or, worse, why his answer may be no. However, when I look back at the lessons of the Bible, it becomes clear that God works on his timetable, not mine. That same message comes through in today's first reading. The apostles ask Jesus whether he will be restoring the kingdom to Israel, and he is clear in his answer: "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority." And then, after saying this, he ascends to the Father. Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus has left his disciples again. But instead of leaving them to weep and mourn - as happened after his death - this time, our Lord left them with a mission. They were to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." They did, faithfully, and they traveled far and wide. Armed with the gift of the Holy Spirit which they received at Pentecost, they baptized countless people as they shared the Good News about Jesus and his gift of salvation.

# **EVANGELIZE**

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

After Jesus gives the disciples the command to go out and preach the Gospel, he says that "whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." He offers salvation for those who believe in him. And he says that the disciples, and us, will be his witnesses in the world. Sacred tradition tells us that Andrew and Philip preached in Asia Minor while Bartholomew and Thomas spent time in India. Others are said to have gone to Palestine, Persia, and Ethiopia. All died a martyr's death except John who had been entrusted with the care of our Blessed Mother. We are his witnesses today, and we are also commissioned to go into the world and proclaim the Gospel. Today, as we celebrate his ascension into heaven, let us allow ourselves a moment to gaze upward and behold Jesus' power and glory. Let the Ascension renew our commitment to do the work he has asked us to do, and remind us of his presence here with us in all that we do.

PRAY We know the mission Jesus has given us and we know we have the Holy Spirit to help us carry it out. For prayer this week, meditate on Paul's words to the Ephesians and ask the Lord for "a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of [our] hearts be enlightened, that [we] may know what is the hope that belongs to his call."

# Seventh Sunday of Easter

Today, on Mother's Day, we honor and celebrate our mothers. From the very moment of our birth, mothers nurture, teach, and protect us with wisdom and kindness. They are a constant source of guidance, leading us through life with unconditional and unwavering love and support. In St. Paul's letters, he tells people how his prayer for them is with joy and never ceases. Likewise, mothers pray unceasingly for their children.

Like the last two weeks, today's Gospel reading is taken from what is known as the Farewell Discourse, chapters 14-17 of St. John's Gospel. Jesus addressed His disciples after the Last Supper and before his arrest and crucifixion to prepare them for what was to come. Just as mothers prepare their children to go out into the world, in today's Gospel reading, Jesus prays for His disciples, asking God to prepare them for going into the world. He recognizes that the disciples will be in the world without Him and asks God to be united with them and to keep them from the evil one. He acknowledges that while the disciples are in the world, they do not belong to it. The readings offer a personal and intimate glimpse into Jesus' earthly life, His relationship with the Father, and His prayer life.

Many of us devotedly attend church, serve God faithfully, and share our faith by proclaiming the Gospel to others in words and deeds. Are we also growing our relationship with God or only staying busy serving Him? God desires to be with us always. "Abide in Me, and I in you." (John 15:4). We need to tap more into the power of prayer. Here are some practical ways we can grow our prayer life:

- + Jesus prayed in public but often went away to pray alone. Find a quiet place where you can comfortably sit undistracted. Silence the phone, radio, and screens.
- + Pick a good time to pray when your attention is not diverted and you're not too tired. Begin and end every day in prayer.
- + Start by centering yourself. Repeat the Jesus Prayer multiple times to help still your mind: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner."
- + Invite the Holy Spirit in. In the words of Saint Francis de Sales, "Place yourself before God. Ask Him to inspire your heart."
- + Remember that the Holy Spirit is your Helper in life and prayer. "In the same way, the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings." (Romans 8:26).
- + Find prayers and devotions that speak to you and use them in your prayer time. Pray the Scriptures. Read a Chapter from Psalms or the Book of Wisdom. Meditate on the Word of God.
- + Listen for God's voice and words for you as you pray.

Go in Peace to Love and Serve the Lord.
